The word 'occupation' has the same meaning as the word 'job'.
A 'job' is the regular work somebody does to earn money.
When we want to know somebody's job we say:
"What do you do?
(or: What is your job?)

With pronouns: (l, you, he, she, we, they)


- What doldo?
- What do you do?
- What does he do?

We use the first 'do' to form the question.

- What does she do? We use the second 'do' for the profession.
- What do we do?
- What do they do?


## The answer:

I am a plumber.
You are a teacher.
He is an office worker.
She is a policewoman.


We are construction workers. (more than one: no 'a' or 'an') We're construction workers.

They are office workers. (more than one: no 'a' or 'an') They're office workers.

## The use of ' $a$ ' or 'an' with occupations (jobs)

We say:

I'm a teacher

He's a farmer.

She's a policewoman.

But we also say:
She is an actress.
He is an accountant.
He is an electrician.

Rule: When the name of the job starts with a consonant Use 'a'
( $\dagger$ of teacher, f of farmer, and p of policeman are consonants.

All alphabet letters except a eiou are consonants.
Here are the consonants:


Somebody asks: "Are you a teacher?",
You can answer: "Yes, I am." or "No, I'm not."
More informal: "That's right", "I'm a teacher."
Where do you work?
I work in a hospital.
Rule: When the name of the job starts with a vowel use an. (a of actress, a of accountant and e of electrician are vowels) a e i o u are vowels.

How long have you worked there?
About 12 years.
